2021 HIGHIGHTS

Summer Student:

The PRCC was successful in applying to hire a student through the Canada Summer Jobs Grant.

Arabella Rookley was hired to fill the role, and she quickly found herself immersed in PRCC projects. Her dedication was a large part of the successes that we experienced in the 2021 projects.

Youth Initiative:

A plan was developed and adopted along with the necessary changes to by-laws in order to reach out to young people who will be our future PRCC leaders.

Beyond The Pandemic Video Series:

The PRCC received a grant through Manitoba Chamber of Commerce to fund the development of a series of three videos.

The videos will be used to both shine a spotlight on Local Businesses, as well as highlight the challenges and successes of navigating a two year long pandemic.

Website Updates:

The PRCC website committee did an incredible job as they worked hard to build and add content to the website which had been launched in the previous year.

Member profiles were developed and shared through social media as they were added to the site.

Hello Neighbour:

The Hello Neighbour program has continued development partnering with the Woodridge Community program to be able to welcome new residents to all of our communities.

A full launch of that program is expected in the coming weeks.

Library of Things:

The Library of Things project was funded entirely by grant funding and has continued to progress over the past year, but has been difficult due to the pandemic.

As we finalize equipment purchases, we look forward to launching the program in 2022 with an event to showcase the program to our community!

Career Symposium:

The annual career symposium has been the flagship event of the PRCC and supporting partners. The event is used as a way to connect students and residents with local opportunities. A number of PRCC members worked diligently with Sunrise Corner in planning the creation of a soon to be released Virtual Career Symposium, showcasing potential Career paths in the region.

Christmas Initiatives:

Local Businesses, Organizations, and residents stepped up to do a record number of food hampers (56), through the PRCC Christmas Hamper Program.

A grant through Manitoba Chambers of Commerce was received to facilitate a Shop Local Gift Card initiative, with more local businesses coming on board and raising funds for the Piney Area Food Bank.

Housing Initiatives:

South East Community Services
Coop has continued to have
representation from the PRCC board
in the direction and progress of the
planned housing project. The project
continues to inch forward with a
tentative plan to be operational in
2025.
