### PRCC Youth Entrepreneur Challenge

In 2025, the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce in collaboration with the RMs of Piney and Stuartburn, Shevchenko and Ross L Gray Schools, and Sunrise Corner Economic Development hosted the first PRCC Youth Entrepreneur Challenge. The Youth Entrepreneur Challenge empowered local youth to explore entrepreneurship through hands-on learning, mentorship, and real-world business thinking. Participants developed and presented business ideas to a panel of local business owners, gaining practical skills in problem-solving, communication, and financial planning. The challenge strengthened connections between youth, local businesses, and community leaders while showcasing the region's entrepreneurial potential. ### Hello Neighbour Welcome Kit

In 2025 the Chamber launched a second edition of the Hello Neighbour Welcome Kit, providing Chamber members the opportunity to get information about their products and services to newcomers in our region. Since the program was launched in 2022, nearly 150 Welcome Kits have been delivered with information about products, services and resources in the region. Promotion of the program has been through bulletin board posters and on social media driving people to an online form on the Chamber website where a new resident can request a kit or a resident can refer a newcomer. ### Library of Things

Through grant funding, the PRCC acquired a range of equipment, including 3D printers, sewing machines, smart cutting machines, and heat sublimation equipment. The Library of Things Committee has been actively exploring options for making this equipment available to members and the wider community. The PRCC has decided to partner with Buffalo Point First Nation Health & Wellness, donating the equipment to be housed at their new Maker Space. ## PRCC Website Relaunch

In 2025, the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce undertook a complete overhaul of its website to better serve members, businesses, and the wider community. This work included updating the background technology and design, refreshing and reorganizing content, updating business directory listings, and improving how information is presented so visitors can more easily find local services, supports, and opportunities.

As part of this update, the Chamber placed a stronger focus on clearly communicating the value of PRCC membership. Information about member benefits, Chamber programs, and advocacy efforts was aligned with the Chamber's strategic plan, ensuring that the website reflects both current services and future priorities. To further support this work, the Chamber also developed a new membership benefits brochure, designed to be used alongside the website to clearly and consistently communicate the advantages of being a Chamber member.

Together, the updated website and brochure provide a coordinated, professional, and accessible way to showcase local businesses, promote networking and marketing opportunities, and highlight the Chamber's role in supporting economic growth across the region. ## South East Community Services Cooperative (SECSC)

As one of the three founding partners of SECSC, along with East Borderland Community Housing and the Rural Municipality of Piney, the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce continues to support the vision of the Timberline Community Housing 20-suite assisted living initiative. With funding from EBCH, Co-operatives First, the Cooperators Foundation, Manitoba Cooperatives Association, and Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, SECSC has been able to develop a business plan, marketing materials, member recruitment strategy (now over 200 members), architectural schematics, and a Class B Quantity Survey as stepping stones towards securing the full funding to build this housing solution in our region. In 2026, the board will continue to pursue funding opportunities and advocate with the Province of Manitoba and other organizations about partnering on this much-needed project. ## Professional Support

In April 2025, the RM of Piney provided funding for a part-time Chamber support role to strengthen operations and communications for the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce. ## Statistically Speaking

Statistically the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce is flourishing. In 2025, PRCC welcomed eight new members – double the number of new members added in 2024 – bringing total membership to an all-time high of 33. This increase reflects growing engagement and interest in the Chamber.
